### ELIGIBILITY

#### Student must:

- » Be nominated by their home institution as an exchange applicant
- » Completed at least one year (2 semesters) of study
- » Meet the Myongji University's undergraduate language proficiency (or equivalent)

# Application Procedure

## Contact your Home University

Students should contact the international office at their home university to begin the application process

## Get nomination & Instructions

Nominated students must follow their home university's instructions to start the MJU online application.

## Complete Online Application

Students must complete the application form at <http://international.mju.ac.kr>  
Please refer to the list below for the required documents

## Receive acceptance from MJU

The Certificate of Admission, Letter of Acceptance, and other relevant documents will be issued by MJU between late December and early January.

## Apply for a student visa

Upon receiving the Certificate of Business Registration, students are required to apply for a visa without delay.

## Book your flight ticket

It is recommended that students purchase their flight ticket after obtaining the visa, since timely issuance of the visa cannot be guaranteed

## Buy travel insurance

Students are required to obtain travel insurance valid from the date of departure to mid-April (Spring semester).

## Apply for KLEC (If needed)

Students opting for additional intensive Korean courses are required to apply separately and pay the corresponding fees

# CULTURAL ACTIVITY

Exchange students receive a tuition waiver from Myongji University for each semester of study. However, all students are required to pay a student activity fee, which supports various programmes and events organised for international students.

**▲ Please note: This fee is non-refundable once paid**

## » Student Activity fee

The student activity fee is a mandatory charge for all incoming exchange students. It is collected by the Office of International Affairs (OIA) and is used to support student organisations, such as the *International Students Outreach Club* and the International Students Association, in carrying out their activities.

### » What is included:

1. Cultural activities
2. World Festival (Spring Semester) or Games Day (Fall Semester)
3. Transportation & Lunch on Orientation Day (Seoul → Yongin Campus)
4. Welcome Kit
5. Korean tutoring sessions (9 sessions)

## ? FAQ

### 1. How much is the Activity Fee ?

- It varies each semester (approx 130,000 KRW)

### 2. How do I make the payment?

- **Via Flywire.** You can find the payment link on the application website after completing your online application.

### 3. Can I get a discount if I do not participate in certain activities?

- No. There are **no discounts or refunds** for students who choose not to participate in some activities.



#### » Credit Information *The total number of credits per semester cannot exceed 17*

Each KLEC session = 6 credits

If you take 1 KLEC session (6 credits) → You may register for up to 11 undergraduate credits

If you take 2 KLEC sessions (12 credits) → You may register for up to 5 undergraduate credits

#### » Credit allocation:

Spring & Summer Sessions → counted as Spring Semester credits

Fall & Winter Sessions → counted as Fall Semester credits

#### » Tuition *Available only during the application period*
